PREPARATION

PSALM

The psalms were ancient Israel's hymns, Jesus prayed them, and they take us to his heart. We will read from Psalm 119 and the 'Psalms of Ascent' each day, in succession, using the cycle of readings listed at the end of this service order. Psalm 119 is the longest psalm, we pray in and with Jesus Christ that the Law of God's love would guide us towards God. The 'Psalms of Ascent' were sung as the people gathered at festivals, celebrating how God had saved his people from slavery and fear. They speak of the New Jerusalem, the coming of God's Kingdom.

The psalm may be read together; a verse each; or by a single voice.

We conclude by saying together:

***All Glory to the Father and to the Son
and to the Holy Spirit;***

as it was in the beginning is now

and shall be for ever. Amen.

BIBLE READING

Read a chapter, or part of a chapter, of the Gospel according to St Mark.

After the reading leave a time for silent reflection, then say

Jesus said, I am the resurrection and the life.

All **Those who believe in me will never die.**

John 11.25,26

You may pray this Litany, in part or in its entirety.

On the isolated...

On those who cannot sleep at night...

On the depressed and lonely...

On the anxious and distressed...

On those tempted to crime and violence...

On all prisoners and prison staff...

On those enslaved by addiction...

On all those who are oppressed...
